If it is a cliché that art and suffering can be closely connected, it is nonetheless true that the Great Depression was the catalyst for a tremendous outburst of creative energy in America's photographic community. The devastation wreaked upon the country inspired a host of socially conscious photographers to capture the painful stories of the time.

Preeminent among the artists of this time was Dorothea Lange (1895-1965). Her empathetic images of migrant workers, suffering families, and tortured landscapes seared the faces of the Depression into America's consciousness. Her most celebrated photographs of that era – *Migrant Mother, White Angel Breadline*, and *Migratory Cotton Picker* – have become icons in American cultural history.

This exhibition features 55 images total, by Lange and twelve of her contemporaries. Highlighted are oversized exhibition prints of her most iconic works.
