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

Dear Members,

Important changes are underway at the Krasl Art Center (KAC) and the Board of Directors and staff couldn't be more excited about what's to come.

The Sculpting Community project is right around the corner with groundbreaking in the spring of 2018.

- This project will transform the grounds into an activated people centered space
- We are \$700,000 from our fundraising goal of \$1.7M
- The centerpiece of the space is a new, site specific, monumental sculpture by Richard Howard Hunt.
- The final sculpture design will be revealed this September
- Please take a look at what 2018 will bring on pages 10-11

When we began planning to reinvigorate the grounds, never would we have imagined that amidst the plan development we would have the opportunity to own the block through two property acquisitions. In 2016 and 2017 owners of 702 State Street and 720 State Street approached us when they made the decision to sell their properties. The Board of Directors felt it was their due diligence for the future of the organization to acquire these properties. Ed Conrad, retired Treasurer of the Board of Directors stated, "In the 1970's it took the board a lot of work to secure this property so the Krasl Art Center could be built here. Olga Krasl would be happy to know that the board has made this investment in the future.'

Presently 702 State Street is being used as a long term residential rental. 720 State Street offers additional parking and will house select KAC staff offices; allowing increased flexibility of use for the Art Center's ground floor. Meanwhile, we remain focused and committed to the Sculpting Community project to transform the KAC's yard for use by our community. This project will break ground next spring and be completed in fall of 2018.

The end of September brings the close of the fiscal year. Soon we will thank our outgoing board members and welcome new individuals to lead your Art Center. As a member of the KAC you have a voice in who will serve in the voluntary role as a member of the board of directors. This year, the KAC will email board ballots requesting a response from you. 
THE **PROJECT**

Sculpting Community is an initiative of the Krasl Art Center. Recognizing the KAC's magnificent location overlooking Lake Michigan, Sculpting Community will transform the KAC's grounds into a welcoming green-space with exciting art, activities, and gorgeous surroundings in the heart of Southwest Michigan. Central to this project is a new sculpture commission by Richard Hunt. Together, the grounds and sculpture will create a dynamic place where memories will be made, creative minds will be engaged, and community residents and visitors will come together. Sculpting Community breaks ground next spring and will be completed in the fall of 2018.

THE PLAN - TODAY



The paths leading to the building entrance weave around permanent and temporary sculpture sites. With Universal Access Design the paths create an experience which draws guests of all ages and abilities into the grounds and invites them to return. Beloved Lotus (The Heavyweight), the hippopotamus sculpture, will maintain a prominent location at the Art Center.



The sculpture garden offers a park-like destination. It allows guests space for reflection, relaxation, and creativity. It is the perfect venue for pleinair painting, weddings, concerts, and community celebrations, all with the framing of the Richard Hunt sculpture as the backdrop.

Richard Hunt's site-specific, signature sculpture will be the welcoming focal point. The inviting arch creates a gateway to the KAC grounds - a serene and inspiring escape from the busy downtown area. Looking from various angles, the sculpture beautifully frames both Lake Bluff Park and the Krasl Art Center, making it an ideal location for memorable photos and special events.

Within the grounds, guests vill find welcoming spaces to sit, play and ponder. The East Garden will provide the unexpected with sculpture sites and active engagement.



The plaza creates a destination to meet friends, socialize and enjoy lunch together. During large receptions or events, the plaza (and nearby parking area) easily transform into a magnificent tented event hall to house up to 200 people.

The reimagined campus provides a new gathering space welcoming community residents and visitors to relax, reflect, and forge new memories. An inclusive outdoor garden acting as cultural capstone at the southern edge of Lake Bluff Drive, and the Downtown District.

In this 3-hour workshop, students will learn the technique of manipulating sheet paper to create three-dimensional hollow constructed objects from artlab artist **Carrie Rubinstein**.
